DRESS CODE

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STUDENTS ARE EXPECTED TO KNOW AND FOLLOW THE DRESS CODE.

- 1. Hats, jackets, and sunglasses are to be removed prior to attending classes. **Hats are to be removed as soon as possible once entering the building.** (An exception is made if the school is having a "Hats on for Charity Day").
- 2. Students are not to wear clothing that may be deemed inappropriate for school. T-shirts with inappropriate words, logos, offensive or double-meaning slogans are not to be worn. Clothing should fit properly and should not be revealing. Spaghetti strap tank tops, short shorts or exposed undergarments are not appropriate for school. **Staff expects students to cover the "four B's" (belly, back, behinds and breasts).**
- 3. Students should have in-door shoes to wear in school.
- 4. In the event that a student arrives at school in clothing deemed inappropriate according to the above guidelines any staff member can give the student a choice to change into other clothing or go to the office. If the matter results in office referral, the parents of the student in question may be contacted to bring a suitable change of clothes.

Scooter/Skateboard Policy

As warmer weather approaches, we would like to remind all students that scooters and skateboards will not be permitted in the school.

While we recognize these forms of transportation have become the number one choice for many of our students, two major concerns have arisen: Scooters are ruining the finish on waxed floors and there is insufficient space to store these items.

For this reason, both scooters and skateboards will not be permitted in the school. If students have a way of locking these items up on the bike rack, they are welcome to ride them to school.

Bicycle racks are located at the front of the school and students are reminded of the importance of locking up their bicycles when they arrive to school.
